Position of the course

This advanced course, taught in French, introduces students to the development of French literature from the Renaissance, the Baroque era, the classical era and the Enlightenment (16th -18th century).

Contents

Content

1. History of literature: origins and development of French literature from the Renaissance and the 'Grand Siècle' to the era of the Enlightenment. a. Renaissance: Humanism (novels and short stories by Rabelais, Louise Labé, and Marguerite de Navarre, poetics of Du Bellay and Ronsard, the essays of Montaigne; b. C17 i. Baroque: features, short stories by Camus, poetry, theatre by

Corneille. ii. Classicism: theatre by Racine and Molière; fables by La Fontaine c.18
Enlightenment: short stories by Voltaire, essay by M. du Châtelet and Rousseau
epistolary novels by Montesquieu and Laclos.

2. Poetry, fables and short stories (Renaissance and Baroque, Enlightenment):
retorics and analysis.
