This advanced course, taught in French, introduces students to the development of French literature from the Middle Ages till the Renaissance and the Baroque era: 11th -17th century.

**1.** History of literature: origins and development of French literature from the Middle Ages tot the 'Grand Siècle'. a. Middle Ages: Chanson de geste, Courtly love, fabliaux and the waning of the Middle Ages b. Renaissance: Humanism (novels and short stories by Rabelais and Marguerite de Navarre, poetics of Du Bellay and Ronsard, the essays of Montaigne; c. Baroque: features, short stories by Camus, poetry, theatre by Corneille.

2. Poetry (Middle ages, Renaissance and Baroque): retorics and analysis.
