#### Position of the course

This advanced course offers a critical reading of literary texts and traditions (XIX-XXI century, older representative texts included) based on critical reading of major

It aims to give the students insight in the problematisation of French litterature (/history of-) taking irony as a starting point and focussing simultaneously on formal and thematic aspects.

## Contents

This course give an overview of important traditions/ authors in XIX-XXI century with particular attention for irony.

The problem is broached and several important XIX, XX and XXIst century texts are

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analyzed. Fragments and complete (short) texts are used.

The approach allows to situate literary texts in a broad context, with attention also for discourses outside of the "Belles Lettres". Attention goes simultaneously to the central question of literarity.

#### Initial competences

Solid command of the French language.

To have successfully completed the standard trajectory of Ba2 or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

#### Final competences

- 1 To recognize the main traditions/ schools in French literature (history of -) of the XIXth-XXIst century, in particular with attention for the chosen topic.
- 2 To be able to situate the studied texts, central in the French tradition, in relation to each other and to the literary tradition.
- 3 To be able to think about the importance of interpretation in rhetorical and hermeneutical perspective.
- 4 To show the ability to think analytically and synthetically. To be able to emphasise relations.
- 5 To be able to write a personal and critically based analysis of a literary text in French (proficiency level C1), with attention for its formal and thematic aspects.

Seminar, Lecture, Independent work

- Guided independant work: personal reading and analysis as preparation for the courses.
