Position of the course

This course aims at attaining level A2/B1 in Modern Greek (CEFR). Exchange students whose mother tongue is Greek may take this course. No knowledge of Dutch is required. Alternative assignments and evaluation forms related to the didactics of Modern Greek (peer teaching, paper) are provided for these exchange students.

Contents

Intensive language acquisition focusing on the four skills. Common European Framework of Reference for Languages level: A2/B1.

1. Grammar: the content of New Greek Language Acquisition I is repeated and supplemented by the following items
noun: genitive; other inflectional models; indefinite and relative pronouns
verb: imperfect; future tense and conjunction based on the 1st root; simple compound sentences
2. Extending basic vocabulary and some principles of word formation.
4. Listening, speaking and writing exercises.
5. Reading of easy stories and informative texts.

Initial competences

To have successfully completed the course Modern Greek: language acquisition I or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

Final competences

- 1 To have knowledge of the basic morphology of Modern Greek.
- 2 To have an active knowledge of a basic vocabulary in Modern Greek.
- 3 To be able to understand easy stories and informative texts in Modern Greek (CEFR reading skills level B1).
- 4 To be able to express oneself in an everyday situation in Modern Greek (CEFR speaking and listening skills A2).
- 5 Writing skills: CEFR level A2/B1.
