Classical Greek, lexicology, morphology, syntax, textual coherence.

Position of the course

This course helps students acquire a more in-depth knowledge of the ancient classical Greek grammar, in particular syntax. In comparison to Language Acquisition I, it proceeds from the level of the word to the level of the sentence and the text. In this course, students acquire reading skills to learn to understand original texts written in classical Greek.

Contents

This course teaches more complex syntactical structures in classical Greek (composite sentences, use of moods and tenses of the verb, idioms, functions of grammatical cases). The course also offers insights in text coherence and word order. Students learn techniques to understand authentic texts that are not read before, with the help of signal words and notions of text coherence. This happens inductively on the basis of the reading of a classical text, initially in a class setting, thereafter independently. Writing skills of classical Greek are enhanced by means of the composition of complex sentences.

Initial competences

To have completed the course "Ancient Greek: language competence I" or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

Final competences

- 1 To gain insight into the syntactical constructions of Classical Greek.
- 2 To gain insight into the use of verb moods, aspects of tenses and the function of cases in Classical Greek.
- 3 To know the declensions and conjugations of Classical Greek, including the less common ones.
- 4 To know an extended vocabulary of Classical Greek, as well as the principles of lexical derivation.

- 5 To understand the principles of word order, signal words and referents in Ancient Greek
- 6 To understand an authentic prose text in Classical Greek that has not been seen before.
- 7 To adequately use a scientific dictionary when comprehending a hitherto unknown text
- 8 To write Greek sentences independently, making use of the knowledge of morphology and syntax, and the extended vocabulary list.

Extra information on the examination methods

- Skills tests: Regular tests assess the progress of students' knowledge of grammar, with emphasis on reading skills (syntax, textual coherence) in texts both seen and unseen; and the composition of Greek sentences.
- Assignment:
 - process a previously unseen text on the basis of specific questions
- Written exam:
 - questions about grammar, vocabulary, textual coherence and reading skills on the basis of texts read previously in class;
 - questions about grammar, vocabulary, textual coherence and reading skills on the basis of texts not read previously;
 - the composition of Greek sentences.
- Resit for continuous assessment is only possible for skills tests, not for the assignment. Resit of skills tests is included in the written exam.

Attendance at the skills tests is obligatory. The planning will be communicated before the first session.
