## Teaching languages

#### Keywords

Dutch, speaking skills, writing skills, academic writing

#### Position of the course

This course aims to enhance the written and oral language proficiency of native Dutch speakers. In the writing sessions, the focus is on academic text genres, while in the speaking sessions, emphasis is placed on standard language skills in spontaneous, unprepared contexts. Additionally, attention will be given to language correctness and vocabulary mastery.

## Contents

The tutorial sessions consist of various components. In the 'writing skills' section, you will learn how to compose a clearly structured, coherent, and stylistically appropriate academic text, as well as how to craft an engaging popularizing text for a broad audience based on scientific information. You will also develop the ability to revise and rewrite texts from others concerning style and language care. In the 'speaking skills' section, you will be trained to express yourself spontaneously in a varied, clear, and correct manner in Standard Dutch. Finally, you will also independently refine your vocabulary mastery and your command of Dutch language correctness rules.

## Initial competences

This course builds upon the competencies acquired in the course Dutch: Language Proficiency I. A solid command of Dutch - at native or near-native level - is essential.

## Final competences

- 1 Being able to edit formal texts for language accuracy and style.
- 2 Being able to independently research literature and produce a clearly structured, coherent, and stylistically appropriate scientific paper on a linguistic topic, in correct Dutch and with proper citation of sources.
- 3 To be able to compose a clear, coherent, and stylistically appropriate popular science text in correct Dutch, based on scientific information.
- 4 Express oneself orally in Standard Dutch in a varied, clear, coherent, and correct manner, even when unprepared.

- Writing: (1) Crafting a scientific paper on a linguistic topic related to the lecture content; (2) Taking a language proficiency test; (3) Composing a text or completing an assignment demonstrating stylistic insight/awareness in the business text genre.
- Speaking: (1) Delivering a spontaneous speaking task during the semester; (2) Taking an oral exam based on the lecture content.

## Calculation of the examination mark

The final score is calculated by adding the scores for the various components of both periodical and non-periodical evaluations. Students must achieve a passing

grade for both speaking and writing skills to pass the course. If the final score exceeds a grade of ten out of twenty, it will be adjusted to the highest failing grade (=9)

Those who do not participate in one or more components of the evaluation cannot pass the entire course. If the final score exceeds a grade of ten out of twenty, it will be adjusted to the highest failing grade (=9). Therefore, students can only pass if they complete the entire exam.
