Position of the course

This study unit links up with and builds on the writing competences acquired in 'Language Acquisition II (Literary Texts)' from the first bachelor year. It aims to refresh and deepen general German language skills with a view to academic written language use on the one hand, and reflecting on texts and text production on the other. The various linguistic resources and stylistic elements typical of different parts of an academic text are analysed and practised.

Special attention is paid to writing, as preparation for writing Bachelor's and Master's theses.

Contents

This unit of study includes

- grammar, vocabulary and style exercises;
- text-linguistic reflection exercises (with preparatory reading);
- practical assignments on producing and structuring texts, including written syntheses of several source texts in German.
