Position of the course

Building on the language and text skills acquired in the first two bachelor years, this course unit further prepares students for concrete written language-related assignments in a professional context. The acquired language and text competences enable students to write a text based on instructions or on an existing text.

Contents

This course unit focuses on text production and text analysis and is based on assignments with specific instructions (e.g. writing an e-mail, revising an existing French text, editing texts based on existing (Dutch, French or other language) material or via transfer from Dutch (translation as a writing assignment)). Attention is paid to essential communicative components (what is communicated for and how, what is the purpose of the text, how do I bring clarity to a message, how will the reader receive the text, etc.). Students receive individual feedback on the writing tasks.

- 1 Having a command of Dutch at professional native speaker level and having a comand of French at C1 level for comprehension
- 2 Having a command of French at C1 level for writing skills
- 3 Interpreting language structures and language variations of French with close attention to contrastive aspects compared to Dutch, avoiding interferences with Dutch
- 4 Having knowledge and understanding of text production and translation processes
- 5 Having a critical understanding of sources and dictionnaries to sustain text production
- 6 Editing French texts independently and assessing them critically, thereby justifying the text type appropriate to the target group
- 7 Critically reflecting on their own thinking
- 8 Displaying intellectual curiosity and a lifelong learning attitude
