**Position of the course**

The main aim of this study unit is to recognise and analyse more complex structures in Italian. The orientation is mainly practical: grammatically correct and idiomatic application of grammar rules.  
Exchange students may take this course.

**Contents**

The study unit "Italian: Grammar and Language variation" covers the structures of the complex phrase (building on knowledge acquired in the first bachelor year). Topics include complex phrase (e.g. infinite tenses), indirect speech, sequence of tenses and use of tenses. The course is structured thematically.

**Initial competences**

The final objectives of the different Italian units of study of the first bachelor year.

- 1 Mastering Italian at CEFR level B2 for grammar.
- 2 To master the Italian grammar of Italian regarding the sub-areas of the complex sentence, and correct use of different tenses and modes.

- 4 Recognize and interpret linguistic variation of Italian, particularly with respect to grammatical domains, lexical domains and pronunciation.
- 5 To orient oneself critically within the discussion of norm and language variation within the Italian language.
- 6 Review and correct written Italian texts for grammatical and stylistic features.
