Position of the course

The objectives of the course "Turkish: Language Practice C" (T2PC) are:

- The students expand their vocabulary to about 3000 words;
- The students learn to analyse Turkish texts of average difficulty;
- The students develop their active language skills, both orally and in writing.

Contents

In the course "Turkish: Language Practice C" (T2PC) the students increase their reading skills through analysis of authentic non-literary Turkish texts. Through the translation, it is assessed whether the text is sufficiently understood. Genres such as short newspaper stories, anecdotes and letters are addressed. Much attention is paid to the specific syntactic structures and translation problems they pose. A number of texts are read and analyzed independently by the students. The vocabulary of the students increases by about 1,000 new words. Systematically specific themes are treated. Through a.o. discussion and role play, speaking and listening skills are built up. Conversation about general topics is central. To develop writing skills, students write essays.

- 6 Expressing themselves in communicative situations of an average level of difficulty in Turkish appropriate to the purpose, target group and media (written and spoken work). [B.6.3.; assessed]
- 7 Independently translating texts of average difficulty from Turkish into Dutch and carrying out translations of complex sentences from Dutch into Turkish. [B.6.4.; assessed]
- 8 Having knowledge of relevant dictionaries and electronic aids, using them adequately and efficiently, and critically evaluating them. [B.6.5.; not assessed]
