Position of the course

This course is part of the 'ritical Perspectives on Culture'course cluster. It offers a survey of 20th-century and more recent contributions to the development of cultural theory and the different ways of conceptualizing culture. Each class focuses on (a) a specific 'chool'or movement, exemplified by prime representatives whose works are central to the class discussion, based on classic essays by the authors in question or (b) a single author who does not represent any 'chool'of thought. The texts are chosen for their conceptual contribution to the analysis of culture, as well as their practical implementation of this analysis. The course aims to introduce the students to reflective and theoretical thinking, without losing sight however of the more practical contribution of theoretical reflection to the analysis of cultural phenomena.

Contents

The course is organized as a more or less chronological survey of key movements, phases, and contributions.

The following movements or phases and authors will be dealt with:

1. Semiotics and anthropology / Clifford Geertz
2. Critique of anthropology / Ludwig Wittgenstein
3. Frankfurter Schule / Walter Benjamin
4. Sociology of culture / Pierre Bourdieu
5. Postwar Asian Cultural Criticism / Yoshimi Takeuchi
6. Post-structuralism / Michel Foucault
7. Postcolonial and Subaltern studies / Edward Said
8. Media theory / Friedrich Kittler
9. Actor Network Theory and modernity / Bruno Latour
10. Cultural and Cross-Cultural Psychology / Hazel R. Markus, Shinobu Kitayama
