Position of the course

The internship is part of the practical course in public history. Under the guidance of a supervisor, students observe and participate in a public history domain and thus become acquainted with the broad practice of public history work. The internship can only start when there is an internship agreement between the internship site and Ghent University. To this end, an 'Internship Agreement' needs to be signed by all participating parties (student/trainee, Ghent University and the organisation or institution doing the internship): <https://www.ugent.be/nl/onderwijs/administratie/verzekering/stage>

Contents

An internship of 120 hours in an institution, organization, arena or practice that establishes relationships with the past (heritage institutions and other media, policy, public services, tourism, justice, sociocultural organizations and institutions ...)

The internship is chosen from a list of employers with a guaranteed professional framework. The internship is supervised by a supervisor. The timing and content of the internship is agreed with the mentor. It is possible to search for and submit your own internship to. Internships can also be done abroad and in French-speaking Belgium.

The internship consists of:

1. Observation of the host; 2. Participation in the operations of the host under supervision of the supervisor; 3. Drawing up a report and a public-historical reflection on the host's operations based on policy documents, interviews with policy staff and observation of the operations.

- 6 To communicate in a written and oral report on the results of historical research to experts and non-experts.
- 7 To work on a project with peers or colleagues.
- 8 To assess social problems and contemporary views with a sense of criticism and historical background.
- 9 To have insight in the workings of archives and heritage institutions.
