### Position of the course

The aim of this advanced course is to help students conceive, plan, research, write and revise a research assignment (Bachelor paper) in the fields of Dutch, German, French, English, Italian, Spanish, Swedish literature or general literary studies.

### Contents

The course helps students to choose a suitable subject for their thesis, to define research questions, to conduct autonomous literary scientific research and to report on this in academic language. Specific research themes are developed in function of the supervision of the individual bachelor thesis. During the seminar, students make a portfolio of writing tasks, present interim results, discuss these with each other and give each other feedback. They also receive feedback from the lecturers.

### Initial competences

- To have successfully completed second year BA literature and linguistic courses or equivalent experience.
- To have advanced knowledge of the characteristics of literary texts , academic writing and the historical functioning of (English, Dutch, French, German, Italian, Spanish or Swedish) literature.

### Final competences

- 1 To be able to independently conduct scientific research in literature and to correctly apply literary scientific analytical methods.
- 2 To be able to report orally and in writing in correct, academic language on the research conducted. To master and correctly applying academic writing and presentation skills in the target language.
- 3 The student can critically assess information sources for relevance, reliability

and validity. The student can use generative AI responsibly, i.e. ethically, transparently and in accordance with academic integrity.
