Position of the course

This course allows you to deepen your knowledge on aspects of the culture of the Low Countries. Our approach is intercultural and is based on a systematic comparison between the Netherlands and Belgium. We focus on a concrete cultural topic (which may vary from year to year), including (post)colonial history, political discussions, nationalism, or cultural identity. We adopt both a contemporary and a historicizing approach.

Contents

Dutch: intercultural project consists of the following components:

- a series of introductory lectures on a concrete topic related to the culture of the Low Countries
- a reading assignment that will result in a paper
- a series of interactive seminars in which you present the first insights derived from the reading assignment
- an oral exam with questions on your paper and on the introductory lectures
