Position of the course

The unit of study "German: Language Practice B" (D1PB) seeks to enhance the skills acquired during "German: Language Practice A".

For exchange students a task will be imposed in substitution.

Contents

The unit of study aims at:

- acquiring and expanding vocabulary knowledge.
- translating sentences and short, coherent texts from Dutch into German.
- writing shorter texts that are in line with the themes dealt with.
- familiarizing the students with the concepts of cohesion and coherence in German texts.
- introducing the students to the German-speaking countries and culture.

For exchange students a task will be imposed in substitution.

Initial competences

Average general knowledge that can be expected from someone who has completed secondary education; no specific starting competences required.

Final competences

- 1 Having a command of German at B1+ level (production and interaction) and B2 level (listening and reading) of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. [B.1.2; assessed]
- 2 Recognising and independently interpreting German language structures and language variation, with attention to contrastive aspects compared to Dutch. [B.1.3; assessed]
- 3 Having knowledge and understanding of the cultural context of the language areas concerned, and applying these to the interpretation, translation and production of written and oral text. [B.1.5; assessed]
- 4 Having a strong language awareness and developing a sensitivity to the similarities, differences between cultures. [B.3.1; not assessed]
- 5 Based on acquired competences, taking joint responsibility and being a team player. [B.4.1; not assessed]
- 6 Based on acquired competences, acting correctly and tactfully in different communicative situations, based on an understanding of similarities and differences between cultures. [B.5.2; assessed]

Extra information on the examination methods

Written Exam NPE (Knowledge test Vocabulary, 10%):

The vocabulary test consists of 2 different parts (each 5%) and takes place in week 4 and 11 respectively. The thematic vocabulary from the handbook is tested.

Skill test NPE (20%):

The skill test consists of a translation assignment Dutch-German and a writing skills assignment that will take place in week 12.

Written exam PE (70%):

The exam consists of a Dutch-German translation on the basis of 6 thematic texts - approx. 600 words in total.

Second session:

Written exam (100%):

The exam consists of a Dutch-German translation on the basis of 10 short, coherent texts - approx. 1000 words in total.

Calculation of the examination mark

Written exam PE (70%)

Skill test NPE (20%)

Written exam NPE: Vocabulary test (10%)
