Position of the course

The objective of the study unit "French: Cultural History" (F2CG) is to enable the students to understand and further explore the historical-cultural dimension of texts and messages. Bachelor of applied linguistics graduates must have an in-depth background knowledge of the countries where their chosen languages are spoken. In the second bachelor year, students are expected to have sufficient linguistic knowledge to understand and assimilate the cultural-historical facts in the foreign language. They will learn to transcend the facts and reconstruct the links and complexities of French society in its evolution. Exchange students may take up this course unit, for which no prior knowledge of Dutch is required.

Contents

"French: Cultural History" (F2CG) offers a summary overview of the history of France. The study unit is not limited to a simple account of the events. Special attention is paid to similarities and connections to other moments in French history or recent events in France. An important objective is to offer text analysis, hereby uncovering important thematic patterns, characteristic of French society. Next to that, we will also discuss a number of books and/or movies, that offer a particular perspective on the cultural history of France.
