Position of the course

The study unit "Russian Grammar B" aims to expand the basic knowledge and skills acquired in "Russian Grammar A". The grammar rules are applied in the study units "Russian Language Practice A" and "Russian Language Practice B". Students are introduced to new, fundamental elements of Russian morphology. Gradually, aspects of Russian grammar are examined in more detail.

Contents

- the declension of nouns, adjectives and pronouns in the plural;
- verbs of movement;
- the short form and the comparative degree of the adjective;
- pronouns (expansion);
- conjugations, tenses, aspects and modes of the verb (repetition and expansion);
- the basic use of nouns and adjectives in conjunction with numerals, the basic use of verbs of movement, adjectives, pronouns;

- systematisation of fonological rules.

Initial competences

Average general knowledge that can be expected from someone who has completed secondary education; no specific starting competences required.

- 1 Having a command of Russian at A2 level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages for grammar (in as far as the competences of R1SA have also been acquired). (B.1.2. ; assessed)

- 4 Having a command of the basic terminology of Russian grammar (with regard to the formation and use of cases, conjugations, verb aspect, the short form of the adjective, the comparative degree of the adjective). (B.1.3. ; assessed)
- 5 Having an understanding of grammatical structures in Russian (with specific emphasis on analysis of word classes and cases and with attention to contrastive aspects compared to Dutch). (B.1.3. ; not assessed)
