Keywords

Spanish; Grammar; structures, word classes, verbs

Position of the course

Knowledge of, and insight into Spanish language structures are required to allow an in-depth study of the Spanish language. In this unit of study, the morphology and functions of all word classes are discussed and practised through exercises, both in our manual and on the digital platform. The approach is mostly prescriptive, and when relevant, also contrastive. Special attention is paid to the verbs.

Contents

This course unit consists of two parts:

Word categories (SISA) which focuses on:

- determiners (articles, demonstratives)
- nouns
- adjectives
- adverbs
- degrees of comparison
- prepositions
- pronouns

- conjunctions
- question particles

Morphology of the Spanish verbs (SISA-MW) which focusses on the different modes and tenses of the verbs.
