Position of the course

The first aim of this study unit is to allow the students to acquire encyclopaedic knowledge in a structured manner about Spain and the Spanish-speaking countries

of Latin America, thus enabling them to correctly interpret Spanish texts, both written and spoken, and understand their cultural references. Secondly, this course unit aims to develop the Spanish linguistic competences of the students by making use of a content and language integrated learning context (CLIL). Students need to have reached the B1 level of Spanish to be able to follow this course.

Exchange students may take up this course unit. Exchange students may take up just one module, worth 3 credits, of this course unit. No prior knowledge of Dutch is required for this module.

Contents

The unit of study "Spanish: History of Civilisation" (S3CG) consists of the following parts:

- Spain (S2CG_SP)
- Latin America (S2CG_LA)

S2CG_SP: this sub-unit offers a chronological overview of Spain's cultural history, with an emphasis on the Moorish period, the Golden Age and the twentieth century. We also focus on the intercultural relations during these periods, and on the influence they have had on the configuration of contemporaneous Spain.

S2CG_LA: following a short introduction to the geology and the physical and human geography of Latin America, the sub-unit gives a chronological account of the major historical eras: Pre-Columbian America, the great civilizations, discovery by Columbus and conquest, colonial era, the wars of independence and the 19th century. Moreover, attention is paid to the material and immaterial cultural heritage and to recent cultural trends.

This course also includes a reading package (reader and/or book). Details will be communicated via the digital learning environment.
