Position of the course

The course "Turkish: Grammar A" (T1SA) is a deepening and expansion of the basic knowledge and skills which the students acquire in the other Turkish first-year courses, especially in "Turkish Language Practice A". The aim of this course is twofold. Firstly, the students acquire knowledge and understanding of the phonology of Turkish. Secondly, that knowledge is consolidated as much as possible through a comprehensive written training system and through oral conversation exercises. These also have the aim of increasing speaking and listening skills.

Contents

"Turkish: Grammar A" (TISA) consists of phonology:

- phonemes of Turkish;
- sound rules for adding suffixes to nominal and verbal stems.

For training besides written exercises use is also made of the dialogues in the handbook.

Initial competences

Average general knowledge that can be expected from someone who has completed secondary education; no specific starting competences required.

Final competences

- 1 - Having a command of Turkish at A1+ level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages for comprehension (listening and reading), oral skills (production and interaction) and writing skills, provided that the competences for Turkish: Language Practice A have been acquired. [B.1.2.; assessed]
- 2 - Recognising and independently interpreting and applying language structures and language variation of Turkish, with regard to the phonology of Turkish and with close attention to contrastive aspects compared to Dutch. [B.1.3.; assessed]
- 3 - Having a strong language awareness. [B.3.1.; not assessed]
- 4 - Based on scientific knowledge regarding the phonology of Turkish, thinking and reasoning analytically and creatively and based on this, solving unfamiliar, complex problems. [B.3.2.; assessed]
- 5 - Expressing oneself in communicative situations in conversations of a limited level of difficulty about daily topics in Turkish appropriate to the purpose, target group and media, provided that competences of Turkish: Language Practice A have been acquired. [B.6.3.; assessed]
- 6 - Having knowledge of relevant reference works and electronic aids, with regard to the phonology of Turkish, using them adequately and efficiently, and critically evaluating them. [B.6.5.; not assessed]
