Dutch as a foreign language level A2

Position of the course

The programme component "Dutch as a foreign language 2: CEFR A1" (XDA2) aims for students at level A2:

- to understand sentences and frequently used expressions related to areas of most immediate relevance (e.g. very basic personal and family information, shopping, local geography, employment).
- to communicate in simple and routine tasks requiring a simple and direct exchange of information on familiar and routine matters.
- to describe in simple terms aspects of their background, immediate environment and matters in areas of immediateneed. (CEFR A2)

Contents

The course unit "Dutch as a foreign language 2: CEFR A2" (XDA2) covers:

- Listening skills: listening comprehension exercises with recorded audio and video;
- Interaction: easy conversation exercises, role plays and exercises on how to use speech acts and idiomatic expressions;
- Reading skills: short texts from text book;
- Speaking skills: easy conversation exercises;
- Writing skills: writing basic texts about easy topics;
- Introduction to grammar.

Initial competences

This course is meant for students with a mastery of Dutch at the A1 level of the Common European Framework of Reference. It is not meant for students with a mastery of Dutch higher than level A2.

Final competences

- 1 Having a command of Dutch at A2 level ("Common European Framework of Reference for Languages") in terms of comprehension, oral and writing skills. (B.1.2 assessed)
- 2 Having a strong language awareness and developing a sensitivity to the similarities, differences and interactions between cultures. (B.3.1 not assessed)
- 3 Displaying intellectual curiosity and a lifelong learning attitude. (B.3.4 not assessed)
