#### Keywords

Dutch as a foreign language, Dutch for non-native speakers

#### Position of the course

This course is designed for students who do not have Dutch as a mother tongue. This course ties in with Dutch as a Foreign Language 1, 2 and 3. More specifically, the purpose of the course is that the student:

Can understand the main ideas of complex text on both concrete and abstract topics;

Can interact with a degree of fluency and spontaneity that makes regular interaction with native speakers quite possible without strain for either party; Can produce clear, detailed text on a wide range of subjects; Can explain a viewpoint on a topical issue giving the advantages and

disadvantages of various options.

# Contents

The learning content addresses the following components:

Language: enlargement of vocabulary, understanding of sentence structure, Listening skills: listening comprehension exercises with authentic listening material,

Interaction: exercises on grammar, vocabulary, speech acts and idiomatic expressions,

Reading skills: texts on the subjects dealt with,

Speaking skills: conversation exercises, pronunciation exercises and a presentation,

Writing skills: writing texts about advanced topics, translation exercise English-Dutch.

# Initial competences

## Final competences

1 Having a command of Dutch at B1 level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages for comprehension (listening and reading), oral skills (production and interaction) and writing skills. [B.1.2 assessed] The first competence implies the two following competences:

 Having a command of basic grammar of Dutch concerning mainly the use of er, order of the parts of speech in the interverbal part of the sentence, the use of conjunctions of reason, condition, comparison and proportional

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conjunctions, relative clauses of the type of *waar* + preposition, *wat/wie* as relative pronouns, *zullen* as a modal auxiliary and the passive sentence. [B.1.2 assessed].

- Having a knowledge of general vocabulary concerning the following themes: health, travelling, leisure activities, emotions, animals, cultural differences [B. 1.2 assessed]
- 2 Having an understanding of somewhat more complex oral and written B2 texts of different types even if the subject or stylistic register is an obstacle. [B.6.1 assessed]
- 3 Giving a short subject specific oral presentation demonstrating a B2 command of grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation of Dutch, adapting the language use to the purpose and target group. [B.6.3 assessed]
