Dutch, Intercultural project, crosscultural perspective: Flanders/Belgium vs. the students' home countries

Position of the course

The course consists of different inter- and crosscultural components. In the first component the students gain insight into aspects of the political, social, economic and cultural life in Flanders and Belgium. Where deemed appropriate, the historical background is explained. The second component regards a comparison between the Flemish/Belgian culture and the culture of the students' home countries.

Contents

By means of guided self-study and seminars the political, social, economical and cultural life in Flanders and Belgium are examined from a comparative and intercultural perspective, each time focusing on the current situation. Students receive PowerPoint presentations, and additional course materials about the topics discussed. In this way, students learn to assimilate the knowledge which is offered to them through the learning materials. They also learn to retrieve and process information.

Apart from that the students fulfill assignments, such as giving a presentation related to the topics dealt with and taking part in discussions following the presentations, preparing a written text about the presentation, and conducting an interview with someone about a topic discussed in class.
