Position of the course

This course is designed for students who want to consolidate the French language skills that they acquired during their secondary education. Much attention is paid to the acquisition of a more complete vocabulary, especially in the field of business French. The students become acquainted with some aspects of the French culture. The ultimate aim of this course is to increase the students' self-confidence when communicating in French in a professional context or when applying for a job.

Exchange students may take up this course unit provided they possess at least a B1 level CEFR.

Contents

The unit of study consists vocabulary and writing exercises (reports, e-mails,...), oral expression exercises (telephone conversations, interviews, presentations, meetings,...) and oral comprehension exercises (listening and understanding the TV news). French culture (tourism, news,...). The students are also given a general overview of grammar.

Initial competences
