Position of the course

The aim of the study unit "Italian: social developments in the Italian language area" (I4M0) is to develop the students' understanding of Italian culture gained by the study unit "Italian: cultural history of the language area". In the study unit "Italian: social developments in the Italian language region" the most important aspects of social life in Italy (culture, language, politics, society) are presented. As classes are held in Italian, students become familiar with relevant Italian vocabulary.

Contents

The study unit "Italian: social developments in het language region" (I4M0) is organized thematically. Through different themes present-day society is illustrated.

Examples of these themes are:

- Italian linguistic landscape
- Italian language and cinema history
- Italy in the world
- Italian and European Union

- the political landscape in Italy
- the fight against organised crime
