Position of the course

Obtaining a master's degree in French implies developing a thorough knowledge and understanding of French culture. The course "French: area studies" (F4MO) aims to provide insight into the historical evolution of political and social structures in postwar France, thus improving student's ability to correctly situate and critically interpret contemporary developments in French society.

Contents

The course is devoted to the history of postwar France (1940-today) and has a thematic structure.

- Politics and institutions: trauma of WWII; domestic policies from de Gaulle to Macron; evoluation and signification of French institutions; emergence of the Fifth Republic; role of national parties and political personalities.
- Societal and cultural practices: emergence of a modern consumer society; new social actors; protests of May 68; heritage of May 68 (civil society, women's rights, LGBTQ+ rights).
- Decolonization: the Algerian war of independence in a broad international context; repercussions of the conflict on contemporary French society.
- Social geography: France's place in a globalized world; urbanization and metropolization; administrative division of the French territory and its social consequences.

Initial competences

The students:

- are familiar with important concepts and realia from the cultural history of the language area;
- can retrieve information about the language area's cultural history, drawing on appropriate sources;
- can frame the language area's current affairs in a cultural and historical context.
