Position of the course

In this course, we discuss the fundamentals of a good project. We cover competencies such as project planning, project monitoring, budget control, risk analysis, etc. We also discuss which tools can be used to support project management activities, ranging from more general tools to specific tools for certain professions (e.g. translation).

This course is given in the *catch-up week* (= last week before Christmas leave).

Contents

In this course, we cover the base principles of project management and evaluate a number of tools during hands-on sessions. The following components will be discussed:

- General introduction in project work
- Project planning (using project planning software)
- Project monitoring and risk analysis
- People management
- Software tools: Plunet, XTM, etc.

Extra information on the examination methods

- **First session:**
 - Skills test (40%): students complete a number of assignments throughout the course.
 - Assignment (60%): students manage a complete project (including quote, invoicing,...) from the beginning until the end in XTM and reflect critically on all project stages. The translation project is discussed during an oral defense.
- **Second session:** written exam (100%)

Calculation of the examination mark

- **First session:** skills test (40%), assignment (60%)
- **Second session:** written exam (100%)

In order to pass, students must participate in at least 80% of all evaluations and obligatory activities such as guest lectures. If a student is absent due to a legitimate reason, an individual alternative assignment can be given.
