### Position of the course

This study unit offers the students the chance to complete their practical training with a relevant work experience in the language, translation or communication industry. The work placement allows them to further develop and professionalise their technological skills while also gaining other substantial competencies and social skills, in line with the postgraduate programme's predetermined learning outcomes

The students will undertake a work placement with a minimum duration of 12 weeks (3 months) in the second semester of the academic year.

Only those students who have taken up a minimum of 40 credits and who have made enough study progress, will be considered for the work placement. The study progress will be assessed by the postgraduate programme's steering committee.

### Contents

The work placement forms an important part of the postgraduate programme and aims at preparing the students for the introduction to the labour market

The placement supervisor will publish a list of work placement offers on Ufora and students can apply for the placements which best meet their interests. Students can alternatively also look for an appropriate work placement themselves and submit their proposal for approval with the university work placement supervisor.

The work placements can take place in Belgium or abroad.

The work placement consists of a specific and concrete assignment which has to be linked to one (or more) of the attended course units and should form a complete and exhaustive unit.

Students conclude their work placement by giving a presentation during a dedicated workshop which is attended by their fellow students, the work placement providers, the teaching staff and the university work placement supervisor. Their presentation consists a.o. of a detailed report on the work placement assignment and a critical evaluation. The students are expected to upload their presentation, including the detailed notes, in the work placement course on Ufora one week before the concluding workshop.

### **Initial competences**

The general competences that may be expected from a master's degree, preferably in a discipline related to the course of studies.  
Having completed the majority of the course units of the postgraduate programme and reaching these courses' final competences.

### **Final competences**

- 1 The student is familiar with language and translation technology
- 2 The student is able to use technological and technical tools for computer-aided translation, terminology management, digital communication, technical writing, project management, language processing with python, natural language processing.
- 3 The student is able to critically reflect on the principles and use of these technical tools and the problems involved.
