Position of the course

In this introductory course, students will be familiarized with the basic principles, methods and developments of second language acquisition and learning.

The course's objectives are:

- Provide insight in the characteristics and nature of the field of second language acquisition and learning
- Provide an overview of the main research methods in second language acquisition
- Teach students how to select, read and interpret scientific papers within this domain
- Teach students data literacy (make them familiar with interpreting result sections, graphic illustrations of data in scientific papers)

Contents

The course focuses on:

- second language learning history
- second language learning research is distinguished from related disciplines such as psycholinguistics, neurolinguistics and sociolinguistics
- the methodology of assessment is discussed and illustrated
- contextual and individual variables in second language learning are discussed and illustrated
- the methodology of empirical research is discussed
- basic principles of descriptive statistics are illustrated and exercises are presented through the online platform
- national and international research concerning multilingual education are discussed
- vocabulary acquisition research serves to illustrate the importance of memory for language learning
- CALL is discussed and illustrated

Initial competences

Average general knowledge that can be expected from someone who has completed secondary education; no specific starting competences required.

- 5 Having knowledge and understanding of simple, descriptive statistics and being able to apply this knowledge
