Position of the course

The study unit "Italian: Intercultural Project" (I3IP) encourages students to independently

expand their knowledge of the relevant language area, and apply this knowledge to a project, which involves:

- completing a reading assignment related to the (inter)cultural and institutional backgrounds of the language area in question;
- linked to the topics addressed in the project, contact and interview organisations or individuals. During the interviews, the students give evidence of the fact that they have creatively processed the content of the reading assignment and of a personal reflection on the relevant social, scientific and/or ethical problems, and of the similarities and differences between cultures;
- reporting on the completed assignment either orally or in writing.

Contents

The study unit "Italian: Intercultural Project" (I3IP) involves:

- an introductory lecture which outlines the objectives and practical modalities of the project, the reading assignment per language and the content of the chapters "Conducting a journalistic interview" and "Interview Article" (see course material) which are to be processed individually;
- completing the reading assignment independently;
- preparing interviews and contacting at least three organisations and/or individuals. Reporting on both tasks to the project supervisor;
- conducting at least three interviews and making a recording of these;
- keeping a log of the completed written and oral activities;
- giving a presentation, showcasing the key results of the tasks;
- an oral exam on the reading assignment.

The students are required to submit their logbooks and give the oral presentation which they prepared (50%). They are also quizzed about the reading assignment (50%).

Second session: same; the students who passed the logbook/presentation section retain their marks (50%) and are only quizzed about the reading assignment (50%).
