Position of the course

In the study unit 'Dutch: inter- and crosscultural perspective' (N2IC), students acquire knowledge and gain an understanding of different perspectives on intercultural communication and cross-cultural differences. The course focuses on linguistic perspectives, situated within

the broad domain of linguistic pragmatics, and on research pertaining to Dutch.

Contents

The study unit N2IC focuses on:

- context (globalisation, migration, (super)diversity) and basic notions (cultural evolutionism, cultural relativism, linguistic relativity)
- linguistic pragmatic approaches of intercultural communication and crosscultural difference:
- conversation analysis
- interactional sociolinguistics
- (critical) discourse analysis
- gender & language

In each part the theory is explained and illustrated by means of both studies from the Dutch language area and crosscultural research.
