Providing understanding of the international legal rules dealing with the navigational use of inland waterways, in particular the pan-European waterways network, and enhancing the knowledge of the international norms with respect to the legal regime of international rivers and other waterways for navigational uses, international IWT conventions and IWT transport policy under EU law

Contents

The legal status of European international rivers – status under international law, substantive parts, beneficiaries, traffic and transport rights, river commissions, relationship with non navigational uses and European Union law, etc. -, and other waterways of the pan-European network as well as international IWT conventions - transport conditions, limitation of liability, social and working conditions, ship's registration and measurement, collisions, waste disposal, transport of dangerous goods etc. - and the IWT and infrastructure policy under EU law – traffic and transport rights, specific provisions – will be dealt with.
