Position of the course

This course is the final course of the total programme and requires participants to have completed the other elements of the full programme.

Contents

During this physical course, which is the final course of the whole programme, students will gather and exchanging the internship experiences with peers, identify challenges and weaknesses in the internship setting and develop ideas for future developments, collaborations, improvements.

Via interactive workshops and discussion groups students will learn how to put personal experiences in a broader context and how to develop out-of-the-box solutions for shared challenges.

This course will be organized alternating every year in Ostend or Galway and will be an opportunity in which students of the programme gather together with relevant stakeholders. Outcomes of the course will be shared with the involved academic and non-academic partners.
