Professionals working within the context of language and communication will profit from an insight into the linguistic aspects of Flemish Sign Language, a basic competence in Flemish Sign Language and insights in the Flemish Deaf community.

Contents

Linguistic aspects of sign languages versus spoken languages, with specific focus on phonological, morphosyntactic, lexical and sociolinguistic aspects of Flemish Sign Language.

Initial competences

No requirements concerning prior knowledge of Flemish Sign Language and the Deaf community in Flanders.

Final competences

- 1 Analyzing the phonological, morphosyntactic and lexical structures of Flemish Sign Language
- 2 Evaluating existing views on deafness, Flemish Sign Language and Deaf culture
- 3 Interpreting the sociolinguistic context and aspects of Deaf culture
- 4 Interpreting the developmental linguistic context and educational context of deaf children
- 5 A limited basic language proficiency in Flemish Sign Language
- 6 Project-based interdisciplinary collaboration to translate content into a practical context
