#### Position of the course

The students gain insight in the ethics of public health with respect to health prevention and health promotion interventions. They know the most important ethical theories, frameworks and concepts applicable in public health contexts, and are able to identify and apply this knowledge in ethical anlayses of health promotion interventions and prevention projects. This course provides students with expert, scientifically up to date, and in depth knowledge of ethical issues in the field of health promotion, both from a theoretical and applied perspective.

#### Contents

• Analysis of and critical study of case studies in public health and health promotion

• Knowledge and critical analysis of relevant ethical theories and concepts (consequentialism and deontology)

• Knowledge and critical application of various frameworks for the applied ethical analysis of health promotion interventions and prevention projects (e.g; framework of Childres et al., stewardship model, criticisms by Dawon, etc.)

• Critical application of ethical theories, frameworks and concepts on national and international public health issues, in depth study of and critical insight in actual ethical dilemmas in public health
