Social Law

Position of the course

The course aims at providing in-depth knowledge and understanding in Belgian social law; which comprehends two fields: the labour law and the social security law. As regards the labour law, the course explores the collective relationships between employer and employees on the one hand and the individual labour relationships on the other hand. Knowledge of the legal issues concerning those matters are important for personnel management. As regards the social security law, the public organization concerning the social security system, the functioning and mechanism of the social security allowances and, as the ultimate safety net of our welfare state, the social welfare are studied.

Contents

The course social law comprehends:

- •the labour law, i.e. the collective labour law, comprehending the bodies and methods of collective bargaining and the individual labour law, comprehending the legal aspects of the establishment, the execution and the termination of an employment contract;
- •the social security law, i.e. the organization of the social security system, and a survey of the different sections of the social security allowances (allowances in case of a work accident, illness or unemployment, the retirement pensions and the family allowances);
- •the social welfare, i.e. the so-called minimal allowances for persons without income.
