Welfare policy and its target groups, trends and challenges in welfare policy, local social policy, governmental organization of the welfare sector.

### Position of the course

It is important that students in public management are confronted with a policy field in which government has a large impact and influence. The main targets of this course are:

- Linking (earlier acquired) general knowledge about public management, administration and public policy with a specific policy field (in casu welfare policy).
- Making students familiar with concepts in the field of welfare.
- Making students familiar with the recent developments in welfare policy, including trends and challenges for the welfare policy field.
- Making students familiar with the different actors in the field of welfare, and with the institutional setting in this policy field.

### Contents

Basic knowledge:

- Governmental levels in Belgium that are responsible for (parts of) welfare policy, and their roles
- Themes in Flemish welfare policy: elderly care, care for disabled, poverty policy, minorities, youth care, family policy, etc. For each of these themes, an overview is given of actual policy tendencies, actors, target groups and institutional organization.
- Local social policy
- Trends and challenges in welfare policy.
- Governmental and institutional organization of the policy field.

Practice:

- Conducting a small scale research project with a focus on a topic in welfare policy, following a clear method

-Reporting on the assignment via a paper
