#### Position of the course

This course contributes to the realization of the final competences of the specific teacher training program, based on the basic teacher competences determined by decree and the specific curriculum objectives. #### Contents

The internship is in line with the subject matter at bachelor level. This course provides an introduction to theory on language didactics and provides a first introduction to practice-oriented activities.

The *reference internship languages* provides students with a first introduction to language teaching and the educational context. In order to do so, a combination of observation and co-teaching activities are part of this course. Students take the internship for two languages. More specifically, students take part in observation and participation activities:

- Observation activities: the equivalent of 2 x 3 hours of 50 minutes

- participation activities: the equivalent of 2 x 3 hours of 50 minutes

In total, the internship covers 10 hours.

#### Course content-related study coaching

The supervision of the internship at school is done by the mentor and subject teacher (= the subject mentor) where the student teaches. The guidance relates to the preparation and realization of the co-teaching activities. The internship supervisor (associated with the training, in this case the practice assistant and/or educational supervisor) is responsible for the contacts with the schools, the individual supervision, feedback and guidance (if possible during a visit to the internship school), the coordination, monitoring and guidance of the internship project.

#### Calculation of the examination mark
