Position of the course

This course aims to provide students with an above-average proficiency in written Standard Dutch, as required in the professional field.

Contents

In this course, students develop their skills in text correction and text editing:

- In the text correction component, we focus on the norms of Standard Dutch (spelling and punctuation, word choice, and grammar), and students are trained to carefully proofread texts for language errors.
- In the text editing component, students learn that a flawless text is not automatically a good text. The focus here is on style, tone, and word choice in formal writing, and students are trained to adapt their texts to suit the intended audience.

Students study the required material independently, using a textbook and online resources. During class sessions, additional explanations are provided where necessary, and a strong emphasis is placed on practical exercises.

Final competences

- 1 The student is able to work with sources that provide information on what is correct or incorrect, or appropriate or less appropriate, in Dutch.
- 2 The student is able to recognize and correct errors in Dutch in texts.
- 3 The student is able to improve texts stylistically and adapt them to the intended audience.
- 4 The student is conscious of the fact that what is considered to be correct or wrong changes in time.
- 5 The student is aware of the fact that he/she will have to continue to gather information on evolutions in the use of a language and the attitudes toward this.

Extra information on the examination methods

Students take two exams (without AI-tools):

- 1 **Midterm exam:** Students correct a text by identifying and improving elements that are inconsistent with the norms of Belgian Standard Dutch. They must distinguish between actual language errors and stylistic choices that authors may make.
- 2 **Final exam (during the exam period):** This exam consists of two parts:
 - **Text correction test:** similar to the midterm exam.
 - **Text editing test:** students identify and name stylistic issues, then rewrite the text to resolve these problems.

Calculation of the examination mark

Continuous/Periodic assessment (40%/60%)

Facilities for Working Students
