Trefwoorden

Central Africa; Eastern Africa; Literature, media and arts; Politics of artistic production, reception and dissemination; Art in context; Art and the politics of memory-making.

Situering

The course studies arts forms and media from an interdisciplinary and contextual perspective.

It takes the form of a seminar with active participation of the students.

Inhoud

This course will approach African art forms from a critical contextual perspective. Instead of neat genre divisions whereby art is regarded as a realm separate from the rest of society, the course aims at connecting various African art forms to each other and to the wider societal circles of context. Focusing on art production, reception, and dissemination, the course addresses the relations between aesthetics, autonomy and politics with examples from literature, film, architecture, performance, visual, material and plastic arts, focusing in particular also on popular arts and media. The case-studies relating to a wide range of themes – urbanity and representation; (colonial) memory and public debates on history; curatorial activism and artivism; art and heritage co-option in politics and conflict; new ICT and tech scenes- mainly in relation to Central and Eastern Africa.

Begincompetenties

Bachelor in African languages and cultures or upon approval of the lecturing team.

- 1 To have acquired an advanced and academically underpinned knowledge and understanding of literature, arts, and media in African contexts
- 2 To be able to critically interpret the relations between artist, aesthetics, and society, from African and diasporic contexts
- 3 To be able to set up a well-argued analysis of the hierarchies involved in art-production, (post-)colonial imagery, and the politics of memory in art production and dissemination.

Toelichtingen bij de evaluatievormen

- A. Non-periodic, permanent evaluation (30%):
 1. Participating in 3-5 in-class assignments.
 2. Weekly compulsory reading.
 3. Participation in discussions/performance during the course meetings. (1, 2, 3 together 10%: component 1).
 4. Each student offers at least one presentation, during one of the course meetings during which this is scheduled and acts as discussant at the same time. (20%: component 2)
- B. Periodic evaluation: paper and final discussion (70%):
 1. Each student selects a session from the program and writes a research paper about its theme (3,500 to 4,000 words, notes and references not included) (60%)
 2. During the final discussion, each student will engage with 3 out of 5 questions that were given for a take-home exam and we will discuss the paper (10%)The periodic evaluation will be considered together (70%: component 3).

You have to obtain a pass mark for all 3 components.

Eindscoreberekening

Except in the case of proven *force majeure* during the permanent evaluation, such as illness or other, there is no possibility for retake of the permanent evaluation part in the second exam period: the mark the student has obtained for permanent

evaluation in the first exam session is simply copied to the second exam session. The student can only be allowed to take part in the periodic exam (i.e. submitting a paper) after having obtained a pass mark for the permanent evaluation (i.e. having offered a presentation, having taken up the role of discussant, and having actively participated in the plenary debates).

In order to complete the course, the student is required to obtain a pass mark for all exam partims (PE and NPE).
