Situering

This advanced course provides an in-depth study of segmental and prosodic phonetics and phonology.

Inhoud

The course offers elements of acoustic phonetics and explores segmental and prosodic phenomena (such as tone and intonation), focusing on the relationship between phonological structures and variation, with particular attention to sociophonetic aspects.

The course addresses the following topics:

- Recording sounds and Praat tutorial
- Sociophonetics: an introduction to segmental phonetic variation
- Sociophonetics: diving deeper into the field
- Phonetics and phonology of intonation
- Intonation, grammar and variation
- Phonetics and phonology of tone in African languages
- Tone systems in Africa: variation and interaction with prosody and morphology

Begincompetenties

A bachelor's-level knowledge of the fundamentals of general linguistics is required. No prior knowledge of African languages or other languages used as examples during the course is necessary.

Eindcompetenties

- 1 Be able to demonstrate advanced knowledge of segmental and suprasegmental phonetics and phonology, and in particular of sociophonetics, intonation, and the use of tone in tone languages.
- 2 Be able to independently and with guidance understand and critically discuss scientific publications in these research domains.

- 3 Be able to record speech fragments and acoustically analyze both segmental and suprasegmental features.
- 4 Be able to demonstrate in-depth insight into the role of variation in spoken language and apply this knowledge to concrete speech samples.
- 5 Be able to distinguish different functions of intonation and demonstrate the link between prosody and grammar.
- 6 Be able to discuss variation in tone languages and its interaction with prosodic and morphological features.
- 7 Be able to use digital search environments and search strategies to identify relevant literature and research topics in the field.
